### 2. Greek #929

basanismos (bas-an-is-mos') From Greek #928

Definition: “**torture**”

Translated: “torment”

### 3. Greek #931

basanos (bas'-an-os) Perhaps remotely from the same as Greek #939 (through the notion of going to the bottom)

Definition: **“a touch stone, that is, (by analogy) torture”**

Translated: “torment”

#### **4. Greek #2851**

kolasis (kol'-as-is) From Greek #2849

Definition: **“penal infliction”**

Translated: “punishment, torment”

#### **5. Greek #2849**

kolazō (kol-ad'-zo) From kolos (dwarf)

Definition: **“properly to curtail, that is, (figuratively) to chastise (or reserve for infliction)”**

Translated: “punish”

#### **6. Greek #166**

aiōnios (ahee-o'-nee-os) From G165

Definition: **“perpetual (also used of past time, or past and future as well)”**

Translated: “eternal, for ever, everlasting, world (began)”

#### **7. Greek #165**

aiōn (ahee-ohn')

Definition: **“properly an age; by extension perpetuity (also past); by implication the world; specifically (Jewish) a Messianic period (present or future)”**

Translated: “age, course, eternal, (for) ever (-more), [n-]ever, (beginning of the, while the) world (began, without end)”

#### **8. Greek #1857**

exōteros (ex-o'-ter-os)

Definition: **“exterior”**

Translated: “outer”

### 9. Greek #4653

skotia (skot-ee'-ah) From Greek #4655

Definition: "**dimness, obscurity (literally or figuratively)**"

Translated: "dark (-ness)"

### 10. Greek #4655

skotos (skot'-os)

Definition: "**shadiness, that is, obscurity (literally or figuratively)**"

Translated: "darkness"

### 11. Greek #1030

brugmos (broog-mos') From G1031

Definition: "**a grating (of the teeth)**"

Translated: "gnashing"

### 12. Greek #1031

bruchō (broo'-kho)

Definition: "**to grate the teeth (in pain or rage)**"

Translated: "gnash"

### 13. Greek #86

hadēs (hah'-dace) From G1 (as a negative particle) and G1492

Definition: "**properly unseen, that is, 'Hades' or the place (state) of departed souls**"

Translated: "grave, hell"

### 14. Greek #1067

geenna (gheh'-en-nah) Of Hebrew origin ([H1516] and [H2011]); valley of (the son of) Hinnom; gehenna (or Ge-Hinnom), a valley of Jerusalem

Definition: “**used (figuratively) as a name for the place (or state) of everlasting punishment**”

Translated: “hell”

## 15. Greek #5020

tartaroō (tar-tar-o'-o) From Tartaros̄ (the deepest abyss of Hades)

Definition: “**to incarcerate in eternal torment**”

Translated: “cast down to hell”

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1. Greek #928

basanizō (bas-an-id'-zo) From Greek #931

Definition: “**to torture**”

Translated: “pain, toil, torment, toss, vex”

- The word “*pained*” was used in the *KJV*. See below for the *EMTV*.

Revelation 12:2: “*And being pregnant, she was crying out, being in labor and **being in great pain** to give birth.*”

- The word “*toiling*” was used in the *KJV*. See below for the *EMTV*.

Mark 6:48: “*Then He saw them **straining** at rowing, for the wind was against them. Now about the fourth watch of the night He came to them walking on the sea, and He intended to pass by them.*”

- The word “*torment(ed)*” was used in the *KJV*. See the quotes below for the *EMTV*.

Matthew 8:6, 29: “*and saying, ‘Lord, my servant has been laid up in the house a paralytic, being **tormented** terribly.’ ... And suddenly they cried out, saying, ‘What have we to do with You, Jesus, Son of God? Have You come here to **torment** us before the time?’*”

Mark 5:7: “*and crying out with a great voice he said, ‘What have I to do with You, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I adjure You by God, do not **torment** me!’*”

Luke 8:28: “And seeing Jesus and crying out, he fell down before Him, and with a loud voice he said, ‘What have I to do with You, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg You, do not **torment** me!’”

Revelation 9:5: “And they were not given authority to kill them, but that they should **torment** them for five months. And their torment was like the torment of a scorpion when it strikes a man.” (Note: the second two “torments” are from Greek #929)

Revelation 20:10: “And the devil, who deceived them, was thrown into the lake of fire and brimstone where also the Beast and the False Prophet are. And they shall be **tormented** day and night forever and ever.”

- The word “tossed” was used in the KJV, while “harassed” was used in the EMTV.

Matthew 14:24: “But the boat was now in the middle of the sea, being **harassed** by the waves, for the wind was against them.”

- The word “vexed” was used in the KJV, rather than the more accurate “tormented” found in the EMTV.

2 Peter 2:8: “(for that righteous man, living among them day after day, **tormented** his righteous soul by seeing and hearing their lawless deeds)--”

2. Greek #929

basanismos (bas-an-is-mos') From Greek #928

Definition: “**torture**”

Translated: “torment”

- The word “torment” was used in both the KJV and EMTV.

Revelation 9:5: “And they were not given authority to kill them, but that they should torment [Gr #928] them for five months. And their **torment** was like the **torment** of a scorpion when it strikes a man.”

Revelation 14:11: “And the smoke of their **torment** goes up forever and ever; and they have no rest day or night, those who worship the Beast and his image, and anyone who receives the mark of his name.”

Revelation 18:7, 10, 15: “In as many things as she glorified herself and lived luxuriously, in the same measure give to her **torment** and sorrow; because she says in her heart, ‘I sit as queen, and am not a widow, and I shall by no means see sorrow.’ ...standing from afar on account of the fear of her **torment**, saying, ‘Alas, alas, that great city Babylon, that mighty city! Because in one hour your judgment came.’ ...The merchants of these

*things, who became rich from her, shall stand at afar on account of the fear of her **torment**, both weeping and sorrowing,”*

3. Greek #931

basanos (bas'-an-os) Perhaps remotely from the same as Greek #939 (through the notion of going to the bottom). The Greek word is “basis” (G939) and is used once as “feet” in Acts 3:7.

Definition: “**a touch stone, that is, (by analogy) torture**”

Translated: “torment”

- The word “*torment(s)*” was used in both *KJV* and *EMTV*.

Matthew 4:24: “*And the report of Him went throughout all Syria; and they brought to Him all those were ill, suffering with various diseases and **torments**, and those who were demon-possessed, epileptics, and paralytics; and He healed them.*”

Luke 16:23, 28: “*And being in **torments** in Hades, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham from afar, and Lazarus in his bosom. ... for I have five brothers, so that he may testify to them, lest they also come to this place of **torment**.*”

4. Greek #2851

kolasis (kol'-as-is) From Greek #2849

Definition: “**penal infliction**”

Translated: “punishment, torment”

- The word “*punishment*” was used in both the *KJV* and the *EMTV*.

Matthew 25:46: “*And these shall go away into eternal **punishment**, but the righteous into eternal life.*”

- The word “*torment*” was used in the *KJV*. See below for the *EMTV*.

1 John 4:18: “*There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves **punishment**. But he that fears has not been made perfect in love.*”

5. Greek #2849

kolazo̅ (kol-ad'-zo) From kolos (dwarf)

Definition: “**properly to curtail, that is, (figuratively) to chastise (or reserve for infliction)**”

Translated: “punish”

- The word “*punish(ed)*” was used in the *KJV*. See below for its use in the *EMTV*.

Acts 4:21: “*So having threatened them further, they released them, finding no way of **punishing** them, on account of the people, because they all were glorifying God over that which had occurred.*”

2 Peter 2:9: “*then the Lord knows how to deliver the godly out of temptation and how to keep the unjust **under punishment** for the day of judgment.*”

6. Greek #166

aiōnios (ahee-o'-nee-os) From Greek #165 (see below)

Definition: “**perpetual (also used of past time, or past and future as well)**”

Translated: “eternal, for ever, everlasting, world (began)”

- The word “*eternal*” was used in the *KJV*. See the following passages for its use in the *EMTV*.

Matthew 19:16: “*And behold, one came and said to Him, ‘Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have **eternal life**?’*”

Matthew 25:46: “*And these shall go away into **eternal** punishment, but the righteous into **eternal life**.*”

Mark 3:29: “*but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness, but is under sentence of **eternal** condemnation--*”

Mark 10:17, 30: “*Now as He was going out into the road, one came running up, and having knelt before Him, he asked Him, ‘Good Teacher, what shall I do that I may inherit **eternal life**?’ ...who shall not receive a hundredfold now in this time--houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and fields, along with persecutions--and in the age to come, **eternal life**.*”

Luke 10:25: “*And behold, a certain lawyer stood up and tested Him, saying, ‘Teacher, what shall I do to inherit **eternal life**?’*”

Luke 18:18: “*Now a certain ruler asked Him, saying, ‘Good Teacher, what shall I do to inherit **eternal life**?’*”

John 3:15: “*that everyone who believes in Him should not perish but have **eternal life**.*”

John 4:36: “And he who reaps receives wages, and gathers fruit unto **eternal** life, that both he who sows and he who reaps may rejoice together.”

John 5:39: “You search the Scriptures, because you think that in them you have **eternal** life; and these are they which testify about Me.”

John 6:54, 68: “Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has **eternal** life, and I will raise him up in the last day. ... But Simon Peter answered Him, ‘Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of **eternal** life.’”

John 10:28: “And I give to them **eternal** life, and they shall never perish; and no one will snatch them out of My hand.”

John 12:25: “He that loves his life shall lose it, and he that hates his life in this world shall keep it for **eternal** life.”

John 17:1-3: “Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: ‘Father, the time has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You, just as You have given Him authority over all flesh, so that He will give **eternal** life to all You have given Him. And this is **eternal** life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom You have sent.’”

Acts 13:48: “Now when the Gentiles heard this, they rejoiced and glorified the word of the Lord. And as many as were appointed to **eternal** life believed.”

Romans 2: (3-6&)7: “But do you think this, O man, you who judge those practicing such things yet doing them, that you will escape the judgment of God? Or do you despise the riches of His kindness, and forbearance, and longsuffering, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance? But according to your hardness and impenitent heart you are treasuring up for yourself wrath in the day of wrath and revelation, and of the righteous judgment of God, who will recompense to each one according to his works: to those who by the endurance of good works are seeking glory and honor and incorruption--**eternal** life.”

Romans 5: (20&)21: “But the law came in alongside, so that the offense might abound. But where sin abounded, grace superabounded, so that just as sin reigned in death, so also grace might reign through righteousness to **eternal** life through Jesus Christ our Lord.”

Romans 6: (22&)23: “But now having been freed from sin, and having become enslaved to God, you have your fruit resulting in sanctification, and the outcome, eternal [Greek #166] life. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is **eternal** life in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

2 Corinthians 4:17-18: “For our momentary light affliction is working out for us a far more exceeding and **eternal** weight of glory, while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are for a season, but the things which are not seen last **forever**.”

2 Corinthians 5:1: “For we know that if our earthly house, this tent, is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made by hand, **eternal** in the heavens.”

1 Timothy 6:12, (17-18&)19: “Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold of **eternal** life, to which you were called and have confessed the good confession before many witnesses. ... Command those who are rich in this present age not to be haughty, nor to put their hope on the uncertainty of riches, but in the living God, who provides all things richly for us to enjoy, to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous, sharing, storing up for yourselves a good foundation for the future, that they may lay hold of **eternal** life.”

2 Timothy 2:10: “Because of this, I endure all things for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with **eternal** glory.”

Titus 1: (1&)2: “Paul, a bondservant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, according to the faith of the elect of God and the full knowledge of the truth which is according to godliness, in hope of **eternal** life which God, who cannot lie, promised before time itself,”

Titus 3:7: “that having been justified by His grace we might become heirs according to the hope of **eternal** life.”

Hebrews 5:9(&10): “And having been perfected, He became the author of **eternal** salvation to all who obey Him, concerning whom we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since you have become sluggish in hearing.”

Hebrews 6: (1&)2: “Therefore, leaving the subject of the beginning of Christ, let us be moved to perfection, not again laying down a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, of the doctrine of baptisms, of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of **eternal** judgment.”

Hebrews 9:12 (&13) 14-15: “Not through the blood of goats and calves, but through His own blood, He entered once for all into the Holies, having obtained **eternal** redemption. For if the blood of bulls and goats and the ashes of a heifer, sprinkling those having been defiled, sanctifies for the purity of the flesh, by how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the **eternal** Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, will cleanse your conscience from dead works in order that we might serve the living God? And on account of this He is the Mediator of the new covenant, so that, since a death has occurred for redemption of the transgressions at the time of the first covenant, that those having been called may receive the promise of the **eternal** inheritance.”

1 Peter 5:10: “But may the God of all grace, the One having called you into His **eternal** glory in Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a little while, may He Himself make you complete--He will establish, strengthen, and firmly ground you.”

1 John 1: (1&)2(&3): “That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have gazed upon, and our hands have handled, concerning the Word of life--and the life was manifested, and we have seen, and bear witness, and we declare to you the **eternal** life which was with the Father and was manifested to us--that which we have seen and heard we declare to you, in order that you also may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ.”

1 John 2:25: “And this is the promise which He Himself promised to you--**eternal** life.”

1 John 3:15: “Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has **eternal life** abiding in him.”

1 John 5:11, 13, 20: “And this is the testimony: that God has given to us **eternal life**, and this life is in His Son. ... These things I write to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have **eternal life**, and that you may believe in the name of the Son of God. ... And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us an understanding, that we may know Him that is true; and we are in Him that is true, in His Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and **eternal life**.”

Jude 1: (6&)7, 21: “And the angels who did not keep their own domain, but rather having left their own habitation, He has kept with everlasting chains under darkness for the judgment of the great day; as Sodom and Gomorrah, and the cities around them in a similar manner to these, having given themselves over to fornication and having gone after other flesh, are set forth as an example, suffering the vengeance of **eternal fire**. ... keep yourselves in the love of God, anticipating the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to **eternal life**.”

- The word “everlasting” was used in the KJV. See the following for its use in the EMTV.

Matthew 18:8: “And if your hand or your foot causes you to stumble, cut them off and cast *them* from you. It is better for you to enter into life lame or maimed, than having two hands or two feet, to be thrown into the **eternal fire**.”

Matthew 19:29: “And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My name's sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and shall inherit **eternal life**.”

Matthew 25:41, 46: “Then He will also say to those on the left, 'Depart from Me, you cursed, into the **eternal fire** prepared for the devil and his angels: ...And these shall go away into **eternal punishment**, but the righteous into **eternal life**.”

Luke 16: (8&)9: “So the master praised the unrighteous manager because he had dealt shrewdly. For the sons of this age are shrewder in their own generation than the sons of light. And I say to you, make friends for yourselves by the mammon of unrighteousness, so that whenever you fail, they may receive you into the **eternal dwellings**.” (See full context)

Luke 18:30: “who shall not receive many times more in this present time, and in the age to come **eternal life**.” (Same as Jesus' words in Matthew 19:29, above)

John 3:16, 36: “For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have **everlasting life**. ... He who believes in the Son has **eternal life**; and he who does not believe the Son will not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him.”

John 4:14: “but whoever drinks of the water which I shall give him will by no means ever thirst again. But the water which I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into **eternal life**.”

John 5:24: “Most assuredly I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has **everlasting** life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life.”

John 6:27, 40, 47: “Work not for the food which perishes, but for the food which abides unto **everlasting** life, which the Son of Man will give to you; for upon Him God the Father has set His seal. ... And this is the will of Him who sent Me, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have **eternal** life; and I will raise him up at the last day. ... Most assuredly I say to you, he who believes in Me has **eternal** life.”

John 12:50: “And I know that His command is **eternal** life. Therefore, whatever I speak, as the Father has said to Me, thus I speak.”

Acts 13:46: “But Paul and Barnabas, speaking boldly said, ‘It was necessary for the word of God to be spoken to you first; but since you thrust it away, and judge yourselves not worthy of **eternal** life; behold, we turn to the Gentiles.’”

Romans 6:22: “But now having been freed from sin, and having become enslaved to God, you have your fruit resulting in sanctification, and the outcome, **eternal** life.”

Romans 16: (25&)26: “Now to Him who is able to establish you according to my gospel and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery kept secret since the world began, but now made manifest, and by the prophetic Scriptures made known to all nations, according to the commandment of the **eternal** God, for obedience to the faith--”

Galatians 6:8: “For he who sows to his flesh, from his own flesh will reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap **everlasting** life.”

2 Thessalonians 1: (3-9)&10: “We are obligated to give thanks to God always for you, brothers, and rightfully so, because your faith grows exceedingly, and the love of every one of you all increases towards one another, so that we ourselves are boasting in you among the churches of God about your patience and faith in all your persecutions and tribulations that you endure, which is evidence of the righteous judgment of God, so that you may be counted worthy of the kingdom of God, on behalf of which you also suffer; since it is a righteous thing with God to repay with affliction those who afflict you, and to give you who are being afflicted rest along with us at the revelation of the Lord Jesus from heaven with His mighty angels, in flaming fire, inflicting vengeance on those who do not know God, and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. These shall pay a penalty--**eternal** destruction [Greek: ‘punishment’] from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His might, whenever He comes, in that Day, to be glorified among His saints and to be marveled among all those having believed, because our testimony among you was believed.” (This passage is so good that it needs to be quoted here. Take heart, dear faithful ones!)

2 Thessalonians 2:16(&17): “Now may our Lord Jesus Christ Himself, and our God and Father, who loved us and gave us **eternal** comfort and a good hope by grace, comfort your hearts and establish you in every good word and work.”

1 Timothy 6:16: “who alone has immortality, dwelling in unapproachable light, whom no man has seen or is able to see, to whom be honor and **everlasting** power. Amen.”

Hebrews 13:20(&21): “Now may the God of peace who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead, that great Shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the **everlasting** covenant, make you complete in every good work to do His will, working in you what is well pleasing before Him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.”

2 Peter 1:11: “For in this way the entrance will be supplied to you richly into the **eternal** kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.”

Revelation 14:6(&7): “Then I saw an angel flying in the midst of heaven, having the **everlasting** gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on the earth, and to every nation, tribe, language, and people, saying with a loud voice, “Fear the Lord and give glory to Him, for the hour of His judgment has come; and you shall worship Him who made heaven and earth, and the sea and fountains of waters.”

- The word “world” was used in the KJV. See these verses for its use in the EMTV.

Romans 16:25 (&26): “Now to Him who is able to establish you according to my gospel and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery kept secret since the **world** began, but now made manifest, and by the prophetic Scriptures made known to all nations, according to the commandment of the **eternal** God, for obedience to the faith--To the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever! [Greek #165] Amen.”

2 Timothy 1:9: “who having saved us, and having called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to His own purpose and grace which was given to us in Christ Jesus **before time itself**,”

Titus 1:2: “in hope of eternal life which God, who cannot lie, promised **before time itself**,”

- The word “ever” was used in the KJV. See below for the EMTV.

Philemon 1:15(&16): “For perhaps he was taken away for a time on account of this, in order that you might keep him **eternally**, no longer as a slave but more than a slave--a beloved brother, especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.”

7. Greek #165

aiōn (ahee-ohn')

Definition: “**properly an age; by extension perpetuity (also past); by implication the world; specifically (Jewish) a Messianic period (present or future)**”

Translated: “age, course, eternal, (for) ever (-more), [n-]ever, (beginning of the, while the) world (began, without end)”

- The Greek word “aion” was translated “course” in the KJV in verse 2. In verse 7, both the KJV and EMTV used “ages.” The same applies to Colossians 1:26.

Ephesians 2:2, 7: “in which you once walked according to the **age** of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit which is now working in the sons of disobedience, ...that in the coming **ages** He might show the surpassing riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.” (Vincent’s Word Study gives this explanation of verse 7: “Lit., the ages, those which are coming on. Which are successively arriving until Christ’s second coming.” That is an interesting point, considering the “Universalists” hinge much of their belief on this verse.)

Colossians 1:26: “the mystery which has been hidden from the **ages** and from generations, but now was revealed to His saints.”

- The word “eternal” was used in both KJV. See below for its use in the EMTV.

Ephesians 3:11: “according to the eternal purpose which He made in Christ Jesus our Lord,”

1 Timothy 1:17: “Now to the King of the **Ages**, immortal, invisible, the only wise God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.”

- The word “ever” was used in the KJV. See all these verses for its use in the EMTV.

Matthew 6:13: “And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory **forever**. Amen.”

Matthew 21:19: “And seeing a fig tree by the road, He went up to it and found nothing on it but leaves, and said to it, ‘May fruit no longer come from you **ever** again.’ And immediately the fig tree withered away.”

Mark 11:14: “And answering, Jesus said to it, “May no one eat fruit from you **ever** again.” And His disciples were listening.”

Luke 1:33, 55: “And He shall reign over the house of Jacob **forever**, and of His kingdom there shall be no end. ... As He spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his seed **forever**.”

John 6:51, 58: “I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live **forever**; and the bread that I shall give is My flesh, which I shall give for the life of the world. ... This is the bread which came down from heaven, not as your fathers ate the manna, and died. He that eats this bread shall live **forever**.”

John 8:35: “And a slave does not remain in the house **forever**, but a son remains **forever**.”

The grass withers, and its flower falls away, but the word of the LORD endures **forever**.’ Now this is the word which was proclaimed to you.”

Mark 4: (18&)19: “And these are the seeds being sown in the thorns; they are the ones who are hearing the word, and the anxieties of this **age**, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the desires for other things coming in choke out the word, and it becomes fruitless.”

Mark 10: (29&)30: “Assuredly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or fields, for My sake and for the sake of the gospel, who shall not receive a hundredfold now in this time--houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and fields, along with persecutions--and in the **age** to come, eternal life.”

exoōteros (ex-o'-ter-os)

Definition: "**exterior**"

Translated: "outer"

- The word "outer" was used in the KJV. See below for its use in the EMTV.

Matthew 22: (12&)13: "So he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here not having wedding clothes?' And he was speechless. Then the king said to the servants, 'Tie him up hands and feet, take him away, and cast him into **outer** darkness; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'"

Matthew 25:30: "And cast the useless servant into the darkness **outside**. There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

9. Greek #4653

skotia (skot-ee'-ah) From Greek #4655

Definition: "**dimness, obscurity (literally or figuratively)**"

Translated: "dark (-ness)"

- The word "dark" was used in the KJV. See below for its use in the EMTV.

John 6: (16&)17: "Now when evening came, His disciples went down to the sea, and having entered into the boat, they were going across the sea to Capernaum. And **darkness** had already come, and Jesus had not come to them."

John 20:1: "On the first day of the week Mary Magdalene went to the tomb early, while it was still **dark**, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb."

- The word "darkness" was used in the KJV. See the following verses for its use in the EMTV.

Matthew 10:27: "What I say to you in the **dark**, say in the light; and what you hear in the ear, proclaim on the housetops."

John 1: (4&)5: "In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the light shines in the **darkness**, and the **darkness** did not apprehend it."

John 8:12: "Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, 'I am the light of the world. He that follows Me shall by no means walk in **darkness**, but will have the light of life.'"

Matthew 4:16: “the people sitting in **darkness** have seen a great light, and to those who sat in the land and the shadow of death, light sprang up on them.”

Matthew 6:23: “But if your eye is evil, your whole body will be dark. If therefore the light that is in you is **darkness**, how great is that **darkness**!”

Matthew 22:13: “Then the king said to the servants, ‘Tie him up hands and feet, take him away, and cast him into outer **darkness**; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.’”

11. Greek #1030

brugmos (broog-mos') From G1031

Definition: **“a grating (of the teeth)”**

Translated: “gnashing”

- The word “gnashing” was use in both KJV and EMTV in the following verses.

Matthew 8:12: *“but the sons of the kingdom will be cast out into outer darkness. There will be weeping and **gnashing** of teeth.”*

Matthew 13: (41&)42, (49&)50: *“The Son of Man will send forth His angels, and they will gather out of His kingdom all things that offend, and those who work iniquity, and will cast them into the furnace of fire. There will be weeping and **gnashing** of teeth. ... Thus it shall be at the end of the age: the angels shall go forth and separate the evil from among the righteous, and cast them into the furnace of fire. There will be weeping and **gnashing** of teeth.”*

Acts 7:54: “Now hearing these things they were infuriated in their hearts, and were **gnashing** their teeth against him.”

13. Greek #86

hadēs (hah'-dace) From G1 (as a negative particle) and G1492

Definition: “**properly unseen, that is, ‘Hades’ or the place (state) of departed souls**”

Translated: “grave, hell”

- The word “*grave*” was used in the *KJV*, but the *EMTV* uses “*Hades*.”

1 Corinthians 15:55: “O Death, where is your sting? O **Hades**, where is your victory?”

- The word “*hell*” was used in the *KJV*. See below for its use in the *EMTV*.

Matthew 11:23: “And you, Capernaum, the one having been exalted to heaven, you will be brought down to **Hades**; because if the miracles which were done in you had been done in Sodom, it would have remained to this day.”

Matthew 16:18: “And I also say to you that you are Peter, and upon this rock I shall build My church, and the gates of **Hell** shall not prevail against it.”

Luke 10:15: “And you, Capernaum, who are exalted to heaven, will be brought down to **Hades**.”

Luke 16:23: “And being in torments in **Hades**, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham from afar, and Lazarus in his bosom.”

Acts 2:27, (30&)31: “Because You will not abandon my soul in **Hades**, nor will You allow Your Holy One to see corruption. ...Therefore, being a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that of the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh, He would raise up the Christ to seat Him on his throne, foreseeing this, he spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, ‘that His soul was not left in **Hades**, nor did His flesh see corruption.’”

Revelation 1:18: “I am He who lives, and became dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen. And I have the keys of Death and of **Hades**.”

Revelation 6:8: “And behold, a pale horse, and he who sat on it was named Death, and **Hades** was following him. And authority was given to him over a fourth of the earth, to kill with the sword, and with famine, and with death, and by the wild beasts of the earth.”

Revelation 20:13-14: “And the sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and **Hades** gave up the dead who were in them. And they were judged, each one according to their works. Then Death and **Hades** were thrown into the Lake of Fire. This is the second death, the Lake of Fire.”

14. Greek #1067

geenna (gheh'-en-nah) Of Hebrew origin ([H1516] and [H2011]); valley of (the son of) Hinnom; gehenna (or Ge-Hinnom), a valley of Jerusalem

Definition: “**used (figuratively) as a name for the place (or state) of everlasting punishment**”

Translated: “hell”

- The word “*hell*” was used in the *KJV* as well as the *EMTV*.

Matthew 5:22, 29-30: “But I say to you that whoever gets angry with his brother without cause will be liable to the judgment. And whoever says to his brother, ‘Empty-head!’ will be liable to the council. But whoever says, ‘fool!’ will be liable to the fiery **hell**. ... If your right eye causes you to stumble, pluck it out and cast it from you; for it is better for you that one of your members be lost, than for your whole body to be cast into **hell**. And if your right hand causes you to stumble, cut it off and cast it from you; for it is better for you that one of your members be lost, than for your whole body to be cast into **hell**.”

Matthew 10:28: “And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both the soul and the body in **hell**.”

Matthew 18:9: “And if your eye causes you to stumble, pluck it out and cast it from you. It is better for you to enter into life with one eye, than having two eyes, to be thrown into the fiery **hell**.”

Matthew 23:15, 33: “Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! Because you travel around land and sea to make one proselyte, and whenever he becomes one, you make

him twice as much a son of **hell** as you. ...Serpents! Brood of vipers! How shall you escape from the condemnation of **hell**?"

Mark 9:43(&44)45(&46)47: "If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off. It would be better for you to enter into life maimed, than to enter having two hands, to go into **hell**, into the fire that shall never be quenched-- where 'Their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.' And if your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off. It would be better for you to enter into life lame, than having two feet to be cast into **hell**, into the fire that shall never be quenched-- where 'Their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.' And if your eye causes you to stumble, cast it out. It would be better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than having two eyes to be cast into the fiery **hell**, where 'Their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.'"

James 3: (5&)6: "Even so the tongue is a small member and it boasts great things. See how great a forest a little fire kindles! And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity. Thus the tongue is set among our members, as that which defiles the whole body, and sets on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire by **hell**."

15. Greek #5020

tartaroō (tar-tar-o'-o) From Tartaros̄ (the deepest abyss of Hades)

Definition: "**to incarcerate in eternal torment**"

Translated: "cast down to hell"

- The phrase "cast down to hell" was used in the KJV, while the EMTV used the actual name for the "deepest abyss of Hades."

2 Peter 2:4: "For if God did not spare the angels when they sinned, but rather confined them to **Tartarus**, and delivered them into chains of darkness, reserved for judgment;"

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
